If this is the situation, you will need to send copies of the new policy to your Archdeacon and the Diocesan Safeguarding Adviser. In their triennial visitations Archdeacons may look at minutes of PCC discussions, reports to PCC/APCM, and at the checklist and policy on display. They might also ask to be shown samples of records of (for example) recruitment processes, DBS checks or training of parish volunteers

Your Safeguarding Policy should be publicised: eg on Church & Hall noticeboards, with booking forms for a hall etc.
