Feedback from Headteachers: themes of the week

Return to school on Monday 8th March:

Headteachers all agreed that they looking forward to welcoming all pupils back to school. Staff are looking forward to no longer juggling remote and in-school learning. Parents are looking forward to no longer home schooling. Although anxiety does remain amongst Headteachers and staff, the feel and mindset is very different to January. Staff are wanting to make the best of it and there hasn't been union action in the same way.

We all agreed that it will be a big adjustment for staff – the flexibility afforded during this period (e.g. to attend appointments during the school day) will be lost.

We also recognised the adjustment (discussed last week) needed for pupils who have been at school throughout this period. They have settled into different routines and, in some cases, teaching groups. They will have to share their space with the rest of the school and settle into new patterns. For many pupils who have been in school all the time, there is a real sense of ending today. Some schools chose to mark this officially with parties. In all schools, these pupils will need to be supported through this transition period.

Concern about how parents will respond to the return to school was raised. It is important that they remain mindful that we are still in a national lockdown and act accordingly. Equally school staff may need support balancing the euphoria of pupils being back in school with the need to stay safe.

We were struck by how, as school staff, we are so used to working in terms and half terms that it feels strange to be making this change part way into a half term!

Lateral flow tests:

Twice weekly testing is available to households and bubbles of school pupils and staff. Information about who is entitled to a test and how to obtain a test can be found <u>here</u>.

Summer term:

Headteachers are beginning to think about what may or may not be possible during the summer term, much of which will depend on the success of the government's 'roadmap' and the extent to which target dates for lifting of restrictions can be stuck to. In particular, whether residentials might be possible was something we explored.

PHA Ofsted Meeting:

Colleagues who had attending the PHA Ofsted Meeting noted the following:

- Section 8 visits to schools graded RI or inadequate have been taking place since 25th January.
- They are narrow and specific (no deep dives).
- Headteachers have reported them as being collaborative.
- Although a judgement is made by inspectors, it is whether leaders are taking effective action in providing education (i.e. rather than how well pupils have responded to or how much progress they have been making). Inspectors are exploring how well the curriculum has been adapted to suit a remote environment (whether online or paper based).
- Although safeguarding is explored, inspectors acknowledge that there is only so much school leaders can do in a remote context.
- No inspections will take place next week (beginning 8th March).
- Inspections will resume in the week commencing 15th March.
- No formal designation (NFD) inspections can take place at any school and will be an on-site visit (usually following qualifying complaint or safeguarding issue).

Information sharing from the Diocese

Resumption of routine Ofsted and SIAMS Inspections:

Ofsted are still intending to resume routine section 5 inspections at some point during the summer term. Timing depends on scientific advice.

The legislation required to reinstate routine inspections must be laid before parliament for 3 weeks so we will have at least 3 weeks' notice before inspections restart.

The legislation to reinstate SIAMS inspections will be dealt with at the same time. It is therefore theoretically

possible that SIAMS inspections could restart late in the summer term. However, at the time of writing, it is probable that (whilst some pilot inspections may take place in the summer term) routine SIAMS inspections will not restart until September.

However, timings are under constant review and nothing is certain yet. Please be assured that **as soon** as there is any concrete news, we will notify you.
