COVID Latest

I am sure you will join me in welcoming the continued reductions we are seeing in the number of deaths, hospitalisations, incidences of illness and transmission rates as a result of the coronavirus pandemic. It is, indeed, an answer to prayer.

As we continue to follow the Government roadmap for the easing of Covid restrictions, may I bring to your attention the following, as set out in the Church of England's latest guidance.

Funerals

As from May 17, the limit of 30 people in attendance at a funeral will be lifted. **However the number attending a funeral will continue to be determined by the 'Covid-secure' limit of the building**. Please may I refer you to the specific <u>funerals guidance</u> for more information and also the Government's <u>places of worship guidance</u>.

Weddings

As from May 17, weddings will be permitted for up to 30 people in **Covid-secure places of worship.** Please see the Church of England's <u>guidance on conducting weddings</u>.

Updated FAQs

- Can we host children and youth groups?
 Yes, please see guidance provided by the <u>NYA</u> and Government guidance for <u>Out of School Settings</u> and <u>community facilities</u> to see what can now go ahead safely.
- How should we complete a risk assessment for our church building?
 Please see the attached template risk assessment.
- What guidance is in place for clergy, church workers and volunteers who are deemed to be at additional risk?
 - The Government is advising people to work from home where possible but if you cannot work from home your workplace should be a Covid-secure environment. Measures taken to ensure this should be explained to you. For more information please see:
