I confess I'm a little late to this particular party \ldots that is candidacy and ordination! O

My background is an evangelical one, being brought up in a Christian family, from which I benefited a solid biblical foundation and a love of scripture and I sit very comfortably within a diversity of traditions. I have always been a keen 'student' and thrived among my fellows during ordinand training and am enjoying being able to continue my studies to MA level at Cranmer Hall, Durham. I have been encouraged by the forum which enables me to have a voice and contribute to debate. Likewise, the Diocese has generously invited me to be on various steering groups contributing to the godforall vison and its recent refresh. I have a passion for people and for the living word of God, so ministry (for me) is wherever those two collide, be it in the Parish church or in the Pub. I also have very strong family connections and am a wife, mother, and grandma, which is where the real stuff of life happens!

That said, I never expected to be able to fulfil my calling to work in the church as a minister for the gospel. I assumed that I would be excluded as a divorced female, and yet it is within the breadth of the Anglican tradition that I have been given the opportunity to do just that, and was priested in September 2019.

Neither am I of any particular political persuasion, rather, I am interested in people. I am also a joyful servant of Christ, seeking to live out my life of faith in the community where I live and worship, and to witness to the love of God that I have found so powerfully in Jesus Christ.

But I recognise that we are at a critical moment in the history of the church, indeed the world, a time when we will stand or fall by the decisions we make regarding the environment; ecumenism; human sexuality; the demanding role of clergy and laity amid financial pressures; concern for the poor and the pilgrim, the vulnerable and the voiceless; to name but a few of my concerns, and how we as church worship and witness faithfully in the light of all these will be significant. I believe that God is calling the whole church to listen attentively, discern wisely, and walk faithfully into the next chapter of our history.
