Hope and Joy:




Vanessa was delighted to receive a special gift at the start of term, not in her role as Director of Education, but in her role as Mum to a Reception pupil at one of our schools.

The start of a brand new school year is full of promise and possibility; there are blank white pages in books waiting for experimental ideas to find their way into being and walls waiting to be filled with colourful captures of new learning. September is smart uniform, new shoes and fully labelled PE kit in correct bags leaving lost property baskets gloriously empty.

For many, staff and children, coming back to school means a slight pang for sunny days and later bed times but a readiness for settling into newness. However, for some, the return to school means bringing back into being worries that have been

pushed away for the six weeks or a battle with anxiety. Similarly, for some, the holidays will have been a hard and challenging time, and coming back to school means a return to safety and respite.

For leaders, the start of a brand new school year means understanding and navigating all of these. The Mentally Healthy Schools website have released a <u>Mental Health and Wellbeing Calendar for the Autumn Term 2021</u>; it is full of ideas and assembly materials, it sets out key dates and events, and includes links to free resources. SIAMS Update Summary

If you missed the briefing and want to ask any questions or find out more, please just get in touch.

- Inspections will restart in October (slowly between then and Christmas, whilst the new systems are all tried and tested, with catch up beginning in earnest in January 2022).
- Inspections will occur in a chronological order, starting with those schools which had already been notified of an inspection.
- No school can legally go more than 8 years without an inspection (this time).
- The usual 5 year inspection pattern will operate after this round of inspections.
- A list of all schools who will be inspected this academic year will be available within two weeks.
- A Revised Evaluation Schedule has been produced to reflect the current context (COVID, no data available etc).
- There are two versions of the Revised Evaluation Schedule one 'clean' one and one which is annotated so that you can readily see the changes.
- There is a suite of other documents available (including Information for Schools and a COVID Protocol for inspections).
