

# Feedback from Headteachers: themes of the week




**Illness:** was a major theme again this week. We discussed how difficult it can be to distinguish what are potential COVID symptoms from other illnesses circulating and that many of the current COVID symptoms are not those identified by the government. We also shared horror stories of pupils displaying symptoms which could have been COVID, being taken for PCR tests which, as soon as they came back negative, resulted in parents returning the pupils to school. They're still really ill and we don't want them passing on whatever it is, even if it isn't COVID thank you very much!

Year 1 Phonics: those of us who have attended Ofsted briefings on curriculum planning were interested to compare notes about the varied suggested approaches to different subjects. At Huddle we discussed the ways we could move on teaching in some subjects, plugging gaps as we went. We all agreed that phonics in Year 1 is not one of those areas. Pupils in many schools are having to go right back to basics and aren't ready for Year 1 phonics yet.

#### 'Life in All its Fullness' What does this mean from a wellbeing perspective?

Look at each segment of the circle and on a scale of 0 to 10, with 10 being you are completely satisfied, what number would you award each aspect of your life? Answer straight from the heart; don't over think it.


Once you have completed each section of the circle, what are you beginning to see as patterns in your answer?

- What would 10/10 look like?
- What would need to change to enable you to move one step up the scale towards the 10 out of 10?
- How will you know you have reached a 10/10 level of satisfaction in those aspects or segments that are most important to you?
- Which section is the place you need to begin and what is underpinning your choice?

Jesus came to give life in all its fullness; when we look at what that means, it speaks of an abundant life. If we take that further, we can reflect on what it means to be abundant physically, but also emotionally, spiritually and mentally. Would we know what it means to be truly fulfilled in all those areas of our lives? Is our balance correct or is it steered too much towards the physical, for example?

Now, as we are completing the first few weeks back at school and routines are now familiar, take some time look at the fullness of the whole of your life. Consider where the balance may need to be corrected and likewise, what 'fullness' in each of the four key areas means for you. Consider what change is needed to bring you into alignment with your vision of fulfilment and then be relentless in the pursuit of your joy.

# SIAMS Update Summary

If you are expecting an inspection during this academic year, please do discuss with your Diocesan Link any support you might

Remember, if you have purchased the Enhanced Partnership Agreement Package, there is no charge for support.

- Inspections will restart in October (slowly between then and Christmas, whilst the new systems are all tried and tested, with catch up beginning in earnest in January 2022).
- Schools likely to be inspected are on a list which can be accessed via the link below.
- Inspections will occur in a chronological order, starting with those schools which had already been notified of an inspection.
- No school can legally go more than 8 years without an inspection (this time).
- The usual 5 year inspection pattern will operate after this round of inspections.
- A list of **all** schools who will be inspected **this academic year** will be available within two weeks.
- A Revised Evaluation Schedule has been produced to reflect the current context (COVID, no data available etc).
- There are two versions of the Revised Evaluation Schedule one 'clean' one and one which is annotated so that you can readily see the changes.
- There is a suite of other documents available (including Information for Schools and a COVID Protocol for inspections).




