Reflection: Reflection on a finger labyrinth



If you've ever run your fingers round the grooves of a finger labyrinth with your eyes closed, you may have run into the same problem I do. I keep trying to go my own way. I think I can predict the twists and turns, but again and again my fingers keep running into wooden ridges that feel like walls. Flow is impossible. Frustration reigns.

Life can be like that can't it? The journey is long, full of curves in the road we were not expecting. The things we run into feel like frustrating interruptions, barriers to progress and the destination.

But perhaps the lesson of the labyrinth is this: our purpose is not to carve the labyrinth, submitting life to our will. Our purpose is to walk the path that presents itself, being present here and now in the journey. Prayerful presence, so that when the unexpected curves come, we can stay in the groove and flow right round them.

"The work of Anti Racist Cumbria challenges schools to consider their curriculum, language and culture.


While not an easy journey for a school to take, this is both timely and essential as the current generation of children in our schools needs to be fully equippedand fully informed to help shape a better world for

Wellbeing Corner: Headspace



Head space is probably something most of you feel is in short supply; in fact, I can imagine that for the significant majority of you, the opportunity to rent out an additional brain for the day in order to increase storage would be a blessing. Sadly, unlike the option to purchase additional Cloud storage on our phones when we have maxed out the potential, that luxury is not on the table. The truth is, however, there is a need to clear some mental space or what should be compartmentalised for work will spill over into the time that



should be for family, sleep, what you might enjoy doing for yourself and so on. In a situation where it is not possible to let go of all of the plates that need to be kept spinning, it becomes a case of finding strategies to help manage the reality.

Headspace is both a website and app that can be placed on a phone or tablet; it is a bank of multiple meditations and resources to support various aspects of wellbeing including sleep, mindfulness, managing anxiety and so on.

Typically a monthly subscription fee is involved; however, having researched the website, there does seem to be an offer of free access for people working in education including schools within the UK: you will find the link to this below. This could be well worth investigating; likewise, the website itself has a range of downloadable material that is worth exploring.
