#### **Reflection:** Life in all its fulness



On Saturday, Morven and I were fortunate enough to hear Professor David Ford, OBE speaking on his specialist subject: The Gospel of St John.

Professor Ford chaired the Theological Reference Group for the Church of England when writing the Vision for Education in 2016.

It was uplifting to be reminded of the synergy between John's Gospel and the Vision for Education. If you need a lift, read Section 2, "Why Should the Church of England be Committed to Education?"

"Pupils and teachers can pursue the big questions of meaning such as 'Who am I?', 'Why am I here?', 'What do I desire?' and 'How then shall I live?"

Professor Ford reminded us about how Jesus wanted an abundant life for us all – He didn't just produce enough wine – it was overflowing. So were the baskets of bread and fish. When you feel downtrodden and are fed up covering for colleagues' absence, managing COVID issues (still or again) or have an Ofsted inspection looming, take a minute. Remind yourself that Jesus wants **you** to enjoy Life in all its Fulness. What can you treat yourself to this half term? How will you refresh yourself? How will you live life to the full?

# For schools which are Admission Authorities:

You may recall that, back in the Summer Term 2021, when I notified you of the changes needed to comply with the School Admissions Code 2021 (which came into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021) I recommended using the Church of England's Admission Builder Tool:

Whilst I still strongly encourage the use of this tool, which makes it very easy for you

to be sure your policy complies with the new Code, some of you have reported having difficulty using it. I have reviewed a large number of draft Admissions Policies which were not compliant recently. I have therefore put together an updated Model Policy (attached) and which I hope you will find helpful.

With 6 weeks of content, **Way Maker** takes pupils on a journey through Lent, reflecting on Jesus' ministry and his example of being a 'Way Maker' and serving others. The 6 sessions help pupils to explore what it means to be: servant hearted, compassionate, accepting, bold, forgiving and a light in the darkness. **Way Maker** helps pupils consider what these examples mean for their own lives and the practical actions they can take to become way makers in their community.

#### Each week includes:

- Introductions
- Bible links
- A video
- Questions and challenges
- A prayer

This resource can be used in the classroom or in collective worship. Challenges can be done individually or as a group or class

Throughout 2022 Carlisle Cathedral is working with partners to celebrate the 900th Anniversary of the foundation of a Priory in Carlisle, which in 1133 became the Cathedral. The year is titled 'Journey and Rest 1122-2022: a Year of Pilgrimage to Celebrate 900 years of Carlisle Cathedral and Priory'.

We want to celebrate life's journey and rest – its pilgrimage – with your school community, by inviting you to join with us in a project to create a School's Labyrinth.

The project would involve your school being sent a pre-designed foam tile – a piece of the Labyrinth - to decorate in a manner which speaks of the journeys and life of your community. When your school's tile is joined with all the others the result will be an utterly unique, walkable Labyrinth celebrating a whole variety of

school communities served by the Board of Education and the Cathedral. As part of the project your school will also receive RE and Art lesson plans, as well as collective worship resources on the theme of labyrinth and pilgrimage, to extend the reach and impact of the project in your school community.

At the beginning of the summer term, we will gather all the decorated tiles together. The Labyrinth will then be installed in the Fratry Hall at the Cathedral for the two weeks leading up to, and including, the Year 6 Church Schools Leavers' Services. It will act as the centre piece for these Leavers' Services and families and members of the public will be able to visit the installation and physically walk the Labyrinth.

At the end of the installation in the Fratry Hall we hope that the Labyrinth will be able to 'tour' Cumbria through the 2022-23 academic year, acting as a focus for local installations and school cluster days.
