The festival falls in the middle of the five-day Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca; in fact, many rituals performed by the 2.5 million pilgrims can be traced back to Abraham (Ibrahim).



Changes to DBS for volunteers

Since December 2024: Volunteer action needed!

The Disclosure and Barring Service has changed its policy on yearly renewals. They'll no longer be automatic. Now, you'll receive (or may already have received) an email from

dbs.update.service@notifications.service.gov.uk

The email asks you to click a link and complete a form with your name and DBS certificate number (included in the email) to renew your update service registration for another year.

You have just 14 calendar days to do this.

<u>Gov.uk</u> tells us: "Volunteers who do not renew their subscription will not be able to keep their DBS certificate(s) up to date and organisations will not be able to check them. They will need to <u>reapply</u> <u>for a DBS check</u> if they need one in the future."

<u>DfE launches consultation on 'narrowing the digital</u> divide'

The Department for Education (DfE) <u>launched a consultation</u> on 21 March, to gather views on a long-term ambition for all schools to meet 6 core digital standards by 2030. This consultation is open until **23 May 2025**.



<u>Do you have a sustainability lead and action plan</u> <u>yet?</u>



The <u>sustainability</u> and <u>climate change strategy for education</u> states: "By 2025, all education settings will have nominated a sustainability lead and put in place a climate action plan". This includes early years settings, schools, multi-academy trusts, colleges, and universities.
