


Partners in World Mission Committee

Birds in Greenspaces

The British Trust for Ornithology is starting a new project to find out just how important greenspaces are for UK birds, and provide guidance on effective greenspace management for birds and people – and they want the help of schools as part of their 2025 pilot.

"Birds in Greenspaces is a new, UK-wide survey of birds that use our greenspaces. Greenspaces are public-access areas of land found in and around built-up areas, such as parks, playing fields and cemeteries, and spaces which provide a number of benefits to both people and nature. Unfortunately, importance of greenspaces for birds is understudied, and so management does not always reflect the needs of everyone and everything that makes use of them.





We want local groups and individuals to take part in this huge, new citizen science survey, so we can understand how people and birds interact with greenspaces, and make them better for all those that use them. With the right evidence, we can work out how best to integrate management to benefit both birds and people in our urban areas."

Schools who participate in the pilot will be helping to shape the development of the project, particularly relating to the way other schools can become involved from 2026.










A-Z of Wellbeing for Children and A-Z of wellbeing toolkit

Make provision about the safeguarding and welfare of children; about support for children in care or leaving care; about regulation of care workers; about regulation of establishments and agencies under Part 2 of the Care Standards Act 2000; about employment of children; about breakfast club provision and school uniform; about attendance of children at school; about regulation of independent educational institutions; about inspections of schools and colleges; about teacher misconduct; about Academies and teachers at Academies; repealing section 128 of the Education Act 2002; about school places and admissions; about establishing new schools; and for connected purposes.

We expect British Muslims to **<u>celebrate Eid-ul-Adha</u>** on Friday, June 6th. This is the festival of sacrifice linked to Abraham (Ibrahim). The festival falls in the middle of the five-day Hajj pilgrimage to Mecca; in fact, many rituals performed by the 2.5 million pilgrims can be traced back to Abraham (Ibrahim).
