



Free, multi-media Life Exhibition at Kendal Parish Church

You are invited to bring your Year 5 and 6 pupils to the free, multi-media Life Exhibition to be hosted at Kendal Parish Church October 20th-24th 2025.

The Life exhibition is an exciting, multi-media experience designed for primary school children which complements the current non-statutory guidelines for Religious Education in the UK.

Using interactive tablets, graphic panels, quizzes, films, songs and a discussion café, Life helps children learn – in just over an hour – about the story of Jesus and his relevance today.

The exhibition, which is free thanks to the sponsorship of your local churches and Christian charity Counties, is aimed at Upper Key Stage 2 and incorporates aspects of the Locally Agreed Syllabus.

Since its launch in 2006, more than 150,000 children and adults have visited the exhibition with great feed-back from visitors including headteachers, teachers and pupils.

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
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Partners in World Mission Committee
