Isaiah 40:31





Enjoying our book recommendations

An invitation to pray the Lord's Prayer together

Dear all

As part of *Faith in the North,* we're inviting schools across the North of England to come together in saying the Lord's Prayer on Friday, 10th October 2025.

Faith in the North supports and resources Church and community primary and secondary schools across the North of England through encouraging children and young people to explore the Christian Faith through the stories of the past, particularly the Northern Saints.

Earlier this year we released our first boxset of free resources, "*The Lord's Prayer Journey*" and as part of this are inviting schools to join together in a collective praying of the Lord's Prayer in their schools at some point during the school day on the 10th October.

Many of you already include the Lord's Prayer in your collective worship, and there is no expectation that you need to do anything different. All you need to do is to find a moment in your school day, either all together or in your classrooms and pray the Lord's Prayer together and our hope is that the opportunity to join together will inspire and encourage you and your students.

We're creating a short video introducing the Lord's Prayer, which you're welcome to show beforehand and we'll be sharing some wider free resources you could chose to use. We'd love it if you could share a photo or short video of your school praying—helping us celebrate the day together.

It will also be great to see, for example, if we could find creative ways to use the Lord's Prayer, to put its words into practice or to see how many languages we can say the Lord's Prayer in across the North?





Improving school attendance

<u>Understand the board's role in relation to developing an attendance policy, reviewing attendance data and improving outcomes for all pupils.</u>

Attending school is critically important for children's life chances, including their attainment, wellbeing, wider development and safeguarding.

Pupils who already face particular challenges, including pupils eligible for free school meals, pupils with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), and pupils with a social worker are also more likely to be absent from school; this widens <u>educational disadvantage</u>.

We have worked with the DfE to produce our guide to improving school attendance which sets out governing board responsibilities and questions to ask in relation to:



- developing an effective attendance policy
- regularly reviewing attendance data
- ensuring staff receive the training they need to improve attendance
