

## **POULTRY IS A GAME CHANGER**

Your support of the Bishop's Harvest Appeal will help give families in Burkina Faso and Northern Argentina opportunity for a brighter future.

The Bishop's Harvest Appeal enters its second year of three supporting the work of Christian Aid in Burkina Faso.

For many of us, chicken is something we simply pick up from the supermarket without a second thought. But for women in Burkina Faso, the gift of 10 chickens and 1 rooster can be nothing short of life changing.

Burkina Faso is a land of extraordinary resilience. In its semi-arid climate, where farming is difficult and rainfall is scarce, families face constant struggles. Layer on the impact of political instability and the harsh realities of climate change, and survival becomes a daily battle.

In this challenging environment, your generous support is bringing real hope.

Through your giving, women in rural communities are receiving poultry—an incredibly simple yet powerful tool for transformation. These chickens aren't just birds—they're a sustainable source of food, income, and dignity.

For families who have been displaced, this is more than survival—it's the chance to stand tall as contributing members of their community. A small starter flock of 10 hens and 1 rooster can grow quickly.



Each year, women can raise between 100–150 chickens, earning 3,000–3,500 (about £4-4.50) CFA francs per bird. One of our program officers summed it up:

"Personally, I see these brave women generating a minimum turnover of 525,000 CFA francs per year. From zero to 525,000 CFA (£690)—thanks to this project."

And that's not all. Each hen can lay over 200 eggs a year—providing nutritious food for the family and a reliable source of income from egg sales in local markets. With a rooster, the flock can multiply, expanding the business and creating long-term stability.

The beauty of this solution lies in its simplicity. Chickens are hardy, require minimal feed, and adapt well to the local environment. For a mother struggling to feed her children, a small flock becomes a safety net—putting food on the table today, and offering hope for tomorrow.

Your support also enables our local teams to provide training in eco-friendly farming methods, poultry care, and basic business skills. In a place where options are limited, knowledge builds confidence—and confidence sparks dreams. Together, we are bringing dignity, sustainability, and a future to women and families who need it most.

## HELP TRAIN INDIGENOUS WOMEN TO LEAD THE CHURCH IN NORTHERN ARGENTINA

More than a century ago, missionaries shared the love of Jesus with indigenous peoples in northern Argentina. In the following decades, the gospel took root and grew in the culture.

Yet in recent years, it's been a major challenge to find enough skilled church leaders to take the place of older leaders who can no longer serve. It's an urgent and complex need within a diocese of 187 churches among five people groups and multiple languages.

Your contribution to the Bishop's Harvest Appeal can help secure the future of the church in northern Argentina with leadership and ministry training for students from indigenous communities.

In March 2024 the CMS-supported Centro de Formación Anglicano (CeFA) was launched offering training for indigenous students. In the first year nine men from the diocese completed the course – and in March 2025 a cohort of 13 women began studying.

Etelvina, 26, from the Toba community, is from a Christian family. Aged 14 she started to take her faith more seriously and within a year was helping with church activities for women. She left her rural community at 17 years old to study nursing in Formosa city.

And in 2024, the vicar general in the Diocese of Northern Argentina, and leader at CeFA, invited Etelvina to study the year-long CeFA course to learn more about the Bible and serving the church.

At first Etelvina had questions: Why her? Was this God's plan or just a human plan? Etelvina is now a leader in her community. She wants to learn more to help the church and to combine her skills – to be a spiritual nurse as well as a medical nurse.


