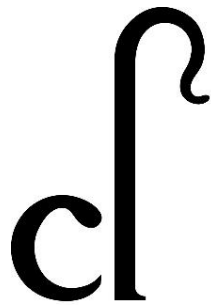
This is a part time position at 0.5 FTE.
